



Visit to Land Rover Jaguar In Halewood Liverpool

On Wednesday 11th January a group of sixteen key stage 4 and 5 students went on a visit to the Land Rover Jaguar factory in Halewood Liverpool.

Danny and Mark showed us around. Before we could go anywhere they had to talk to us about health and safety. They told us what to do in case of a fire alarm and that we had to stay walking inside the yellow lines because there were a lot of trucks moving round.

Before we went in the factory we had to put on eye protection and a high visibility jacket.

As soon as we went inside it was very noisy. There were lots of robots building the cars because they can build faster and better.



The machines were all doing different jobs. The cars moved around the factory on conveyor belts as part of the production line.

There are 3000 people working in the factory. They worked 8 hours a day on shifts. They had to have their breaks in the middle of all the noise in the factory in small canteen areas, they had ear plugs to block out some of the noise.

The men and women were doing lots of jobs like putting the electrics in to the cars, putting rivets in, fitting switches and dashboards.

The cars had steering wheels on the right or left sides depending on which country they were going to. Many of the cars were being shipped to China, America, Italy and Japan.

Each section had to stamp a smiley face on a checklist when they had finished with it. When the cars were finished they had to check there were no problems with them.

All the cars are put on to a train in the factory's train station to be taken away and then shipped to the different countries.

When we got back to school we worked out that there are 520 cars made each day and they cost £35,000 each so the total made is £18,000,000.

It was a very successful, interesting trip.
